


Canada (Real manufacturing GDP, annual % change)






CANADA RANKS SECOND LAST AMONG OECD COUNTRIES IN BUSINESS INVESTMENT GROWTH

2016-20 (non-residential business investment, constant prices, national base year, compound annual growth rate, %)






INVESTMENT TRENDS IN MANUFACTURING DISCOURAGING





CANADA'S TRADE DEFICIT IN MANUFACTURED GOODS CONTINUES TO BALLOON


Trade balance in manufactured goods (billions \$)





LABOUR PRODUCTIVITY HAS DECLINED IN 11 OUT OF THE 12 LAST QUARTERS


Canada (business sector, quarterly % change, seasonally adjusted)
